



CASSADY AVENUE CORRIDOR STUDY

The City Of Columbus Transportation Division selected a team of traffic engineers, civil engineers, landscape architects and urban planners to create conceptual design studies for this 3.5 mile arterial on the city's east side. The growth of New Albany, Gahanna and the airport is creating development pressure on this corridor, which runs from the north end of the suburb of Bexley to Morse Road. The plan incorporates a pedestrian friendly streetscape that links residential neighborhoods south of I-670 with a new planned bike trail along Alum Creek. The plan includes a variety of "complete street" solutions such as in-road bike lanes, boulevards, roundabouts and traffic calming features.
